One of the most successful players of her era, Kathryn represented Australia for 11 years (95 caps) in her usual positions of goal defence and wing defence, including four years as captain from 2000 to 2003. She was victorious at two World Championships in 1995 and 1999, and part of the team winning gold at two Commonwealth Games in 1998 and 2002.

Whether it was as a player or captain with Contax in an era that turned our club into a powerhouse in the State League or playing and Captaining Australia, she had a massive influence in the game.

A champion defender who played with enormous heart and passion and her competitive streak ran deep, refusing to concede a contest without a 100 percent fight.

She was the inaugural captain of the Adelaide Thunderbirds in the Commonwealth Bank Trophy national league from 1997 until 2003, leading the team to back-to-back premierships 1998 and 1999.

Kathryn was honoured in the 2018 Queen's Birthday Honours in 2018 and made a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) for "significant service to netball as a player, national captain, coach, commentator, board member and player's advocate".
